

COORDINATING GE SEGMENT III WITH THE CHILD AND ADOLESCENT DEVELOPMENT MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

Students are required by the University to complete nine upper division units of General Education (“Segment III”) at San Francisco State University. There are a number of requirements which apply to completing Segment III. These can be found printed in both the Bulletin and Class Schedule, and also can be found on the SFSU website. Before beginning your Segment III< these requirements should be read carefully and understood.

To meet the GE Segment III Requirements, you must complete three courses within any one cluster included in Segment III (Not just those listed below), following the specific requirements listed for the cluster.

Two of the courses used for the cluster may be used for both Segment III and the major. Note, however that the units count only once toward the 124 units required for graduation. In selecting courses which can be counted toward both GE and the major, you need to check carefully that the course meets a requirement in the CAD core or in your concentration which you have not otherwise met.

Following Segment III clusters include courses which are also included as options in the Core or Concentration requirements for the CAD major. Courses which are included as options within the CAD major are printed in bold and have (CAD) after the title in the lists on the following pages.
