- All core and concentration courses for the Child and Adolescent Development major must be taken for a letter grade (except for fieldwork courses which are offered only for CR/NC).
- A grade of C or better is required for all courses in the major
- CAD 210, 260 and ENG 214 (or community college equivalents) must be completed with grade of C or better before enrollment in CAD 410, CAD 450, 460, CAD 625, and CAD 650. No concurrent enrollment allowed. Proof of community college equivalent courses is required.
- CAD 410 and ENG 214 must be completed with grade of C or better before enrollment in CAD 500GW. No concurrent enrollment allowed. Proof of community college equivalent for ENG 214 is required.
- Internship Applications – Must be submitted one semester prior to one's projected internship semester. See CAD website for specific deadline dates. <http://cad.sfsu.edu>
- A minimum of 30 units must be completed in CAD core & concentration to apply for fieldwork.
