Department Policies (Please read)

- All core and concentration courses for the Child and Adolescent Development major must be taken for a letter grade (except for internship which is offered only for CR/NC).
- A grade of C or better is required for **all** courses in the major.
- CAD 210 and CAD 260 (or community college equivalents) must be completed with grade of C or better and ENG 214 (or community college equivalent) must be completed with a grade of C- or better before enrollment in CAD 410, CAD 450, 460, CAD 625 and CAD 650. No concurrent enrollment allowed. Proof of community college equivalent courses is required.
- CAD 410 must be completed with grade of C or better and ENG 214 with grade of C- or better before enrollment in CAD 500GW. No concurrent enrollment allowed. Proof of community college equivalent for ENG 214 is required.
- Internships take place the final semester of the senior year. To apply for Internship the application must be submitted one semester prior to the student's final semester. See CAD website for specific deadline dates. <http://cad.sfsu.edu> Minimum of 30 units must be completed in CAD core & concentration prior to start of internship. Includes all core Foundations courses and CAD 215 (or equivalent) in the EC concentration.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 150 pre-internship hours required. Work/volunteer hours in a licensed center/program with children birth to 5 yrs. Hours must be documented and on file in CAD office prior to start of internship. *See CAD website for deadline. Internship must be conducted on campus at either ASI ECEC or Children's Campus. Lower division CAP 8 – Practicum course hours can be used toward 150 pre-internship required hours. E ED course hours do NOT count toward CAD department requirement of 150 documented pre-internship hours. CAD 215 (or community college equivalent) must be completed prior to internship. 					

Important Notes:

- E ED Courses: The Elementary Education Department policy requires 30 hours observation/participation outside the classroom all for Elementary Education courses (E ED). If a student takes more than one Elementary Education course per semester, 30 hours are the maximum required and will count for all Elementary Education courses taken in that specific semester.
- Students must complete 2 courses in SPED, one at 300 level and one at 600 level.
