**Department Policies** – Please read

- ♦ All core and concentration courses for CAD major must be taken for a letter grade. Exception is internship which is CR/NC.
- ♦ Grade of C or better is required for **all** courses in major including core and concentration. Includes courses transferred from other colleges.
- ♦ CAD 210 and CAD 260 (or community college equivalents) must be completed with grade of C or better and ENG 214 (or equivalent) with a C- or better before enrollment in CAD 410, CAD 450 or 460, and CAD 625 or CAD 650. No concurrent enrollment allowed. Proof of community college equivalent courses is required with transcript.
- ♦ CAD 410 must be completed with grade of C and ENG 214 with a C- or better before enrollment in CAD 500GW. No concurrent enrollment allowed. Proof of community college equivalent for ENG 214 is required.
- ♦ Internships take place in **final** semester at university. The internship application must be submitted one semester prior to student's final semester. See CAD website for specific deadline dates. <http://cad.sfsu.edu> Minimum of 30 units must be completed in CAD core & concentration prior to start of internship. Includes all core Foundations courses and CAD 215 (or equivalent) in EC concentration.

**\*Important Notes** about EC Concentration – **Please read; you are accountable for this information.**

- 150 pre-internship hours required. Work/volunteer hours in a **licensed center/program** with children birth to 5 yrs. Hours must be documented and on file in CAD office prior to start of internship. \*See CAD website for internship deadline. Internship cancelled without proper pre-internship documentation.
- Lower division CAP 8: maximum 90 hours from community college Practicum course can be used toward 150 required pre-internship hours. Grade in class must be C or better. Verification by transcript is sufficient documentation.
- EC Internship must be conducted on campus at either ASI ECEC or Children's Campus.
- CAD 215 (or community college equivalent) must be completed prior to internship with grade of C or better
- Two upper division SPED courses required – one at 300 level and one at 600 level. Select from EC concentration.
- The Elementary Education Department (E ED) requires 30 hours observation/participation outside the classroom per E ED course. However, if a student takes more than one E ED course per semester, 30 hours becomes the maximum required and will count for all E ED courses taken in that specific semester.
- The E ED course hours do **NOT** count toward CAD department requirement of 150 documented pre-internship hours

**Course Numbering** – Courses numbered between 100-299 are Lower Division courses. Courses numbered between 300-699 are Upper Division courses. Lower Division courses cannot be used in substitution for Upper Division courses.
