#### **Child and Adolescent Development**

## **Department Policies:**

- All core and concentration courses for CAD major must be taken for a letter grade. Exception is internship (CAD 601) which is CR/NC.
- Grade of C or better is required for **all** courses in major including core and concentration. Includes courses transferred from other colleges.
- CAD 210 and CAD 260 (or community college equivalents) must be completed with grade of C or better and ENG 214 (or equivalent) with a C- or better <u>before</u> enrollment in CAD 300, 410, CAD 450, and CAD 625. No concurrent enrollment allowed. Proof of community college equivalent courses is required with transcript.
- CAD 410 must be completed with grade of C and ENG 214 with a C- or better <u>before</u> enrollment in CAD 500GW. No concurrent enrollment allowed. Proof of community college equivalent for ENG 214 is required with transcript.
- Internships take place in **final** semester at university. The internship application must be submitted one semester prior to student's final semester. See CAD website for specific deadline dates <a href="http://cad.sfsu.edu">http://cad.sfsu.edu</a>. Minimum of 30 units must be completed in CAD core & concentration prior to start of internship. CAD 215 must be completed prior to start of internship for EC concentration. CAD 600 & CAD 601 must be taken concurrently.

## **Important Notes:**

- To avoid taking additional units, it is recommended that you meet LLD and SF State Studies requirements (AERM, GP, ES, SJ) within your GE or major.
- To fulfill the Complementary Studies requirement, all students completing a B.A. Degree must take 12 units from courses outside of the primary prefix of their major and not cross-listed with the primary prefix for the major. This requirement is automatically fulfilled when completing a Child and Adolescent Development major. Students may need to take additional units, however, to reach the 120 minimum units required for graduation.
- Students will need to apply for graduation at the beginning of their last semester, please visit the Registrar's Office website for more information and specific dates <a href="https://registrar.sfsu.edu/content/applying-graduation">https://registrar.sfsu.edu/content/applying-graduation</a>.
- Courses numbered between 100-299 are Lower Division courses. Courses numbered between 300-699 are Upper Division courses. Lower Division courses cannot be used in substitution for Upper Division courses.

## **Early Childhood Concentration**

- Elementary Education Course Policy: 30 hours observation/participation outside the classroom are required for Elementary Education courses (E ED). If a student takes more than one Elementary Education course per semester, 30 hours are the maximum total required and will cover all Elementary Education courses taken in that specific semester.
- **Internship:** EC Internship <u>must</u> be conducted on campus at either AS ECEC or Children's Campus. The CAD Department supports with placement. The following need to be completed <u>prior</u> to the start of your internship:
  - □ **150 volunteer/work hours** in a licensed center/program with children birth to five years. Hours must be documented an on file in the CAD office prior to the start of the internship.
    - Lower division CAP 8: maximum 90 hours from community college Practicum course can be used toward 150 required pre-internship hours. Grade in class must be C or better. Verification by transcript is sufficient documentation.
    - The 150 hours can be by work/volunteering; students must be participating in the classroom with young children -observation hours not included in 150 hours.
    - Practicum course can be used toward the 150 hours.
  - CAD 215 (or community college equivalent) or CAD 230 must be completed prior to internship with grade of C or better.
